

How WIC Impacts the People of Wisconsin

The NWA creates State Profiles on how WIC affect the health of populations in each state. Open the <u>Wisconsin State Profile</u> handout to view more information or to print the information yourself.

- Average monthly participation in Wisconsin 2014: 108,901 participants
- 20.7% of Wisconsin children are food insecure-WIC helps combat food insecurity and contributes to reducing obesity and chronic disease.
- Wisconsin breastfeeding rates in 2014 were at 72%, above the National WIC average of 70%.
- Program integrity has improved by implementing WIC EBT in 2015.
